DRAFT 2026 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN  
PUBLIC HEARING

The Community Development Division of Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government's Department of Housing & Human Services has prepared a draft Annual Action Plan for its 2026 Community Development Block Grant and HOME Investment Partnership Programs as required by the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development. All interested parties are invited to review the document, as well as comment and/or ask questions. The Annual Action Plan describes how the anticipated 2026 grant funds will address the housing and community development needs identified in Terrebonne Parish's 2025-2029 Five-Year Consolidated Plan.

The draft Annual Action Plan will be available for review beginning Friday, May 01, 2026, and ending Monday, June 01, 2026, at 4:00 pm. The plan will be submitted to HUD on or after Tuesday, June 02, 2026.
