Home Sewage Assistance Program

for

Residents in the Upper Bayou Terrebonne Watershed

The **Barataria-Terrebonne National Estuary Program** in partnership with the **Louisiana Universities Marine Consortium** and **South Central Planning and Development Commission** are collaborating with the **U.S. Environmental Protection Agency** to **reimburse** homeowners to fix their home sewage systems along Upper Bayou Terrebonne.

WE WILL PAY YOU TO FIX YOUR HOME SEWAGE SYSTEM!

WHERE? This program is being provided to homeowners in parts of **Lafourche and Terrebonne Parishes** along Upper Bayou Terrebonne.

WHO? The **Barataria- Terrebonne National Estuary Program** in partnership with the **Louisiana Universities Marine Consortium** obtained a grant to fix home sewage systems. **South Central Planning and Development Commission (SCPDC)** will implement the program and reimburse eligible residents. **SCPDC** will visit residential sites to identify broken systems.

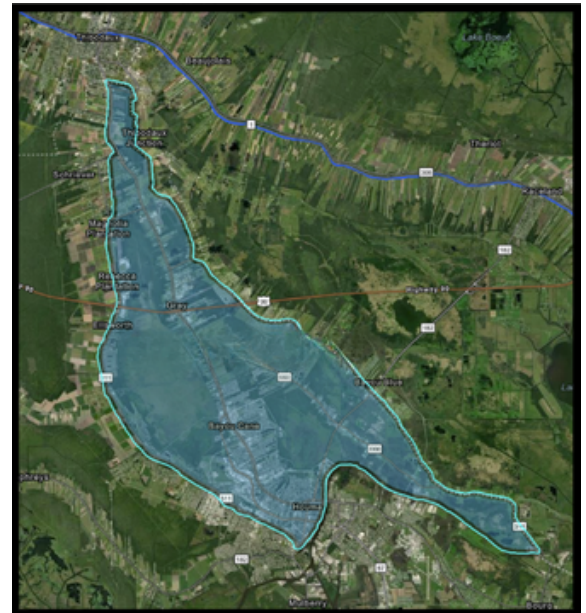
HOW? This reimbursement program is simple:

- Once SCPDC identifies a broken system, they will refer those homeowners for financial assistance.
- Homeowners must sign up to receive benefits from the program.
- A licensed contractor will provide an estimate for the repair, work, and fix the system.
- SCPDC will re-inspect to make sure all work was done.
- Reimbursements pay 100% of the first \$700, then **50% of remaining costs up to a maximum of \$2,000** in costs incurred by non-low income homeowners. Low income applicants could receive up to **\$4,000 at 100%**.

WHY PARTICIPATE? To **save** between \$2,000 and \$4,000 in costly sewage repairs, to **protect** your family's health, and to **protect** our drinking water.

Upper Bayou Terrebonne Watershed

A watershed program helps take care of the land and water in a specific region. It focuses on keeping the water clean, stopping flooding and contamination, protecting plants and animals, and making sure people have enough water to use.
