D-SNAP

D-SNAP operations have been approved for some areas in the following parishes:

- Avoyelles
- St. Landry
- Terrebonne
- St. Tammany



D-SNAP is based on income and 2020 Census tracts. If you live in one of the following parishes, scan the QR code to check your census tract eligibility. When the map appears, click or tap on the magnifying glass in the top-right corner, then type in your address. **If you are within the shaded area and are determined income-eligible, you are eligible for D-SNAP** and should follow the instructions below.

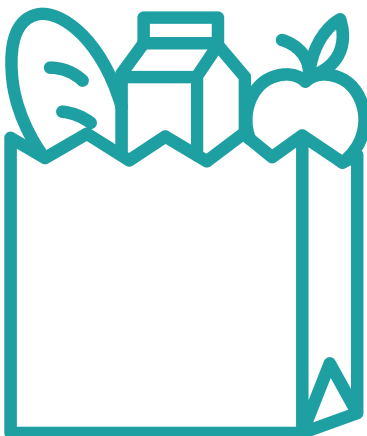

HOW TO APPLY

Eligible residents in areas of the affected parishes should apply via phone on their assigned day by calling the LAHelpU Customer Service Center at 888-LAHELP-U (888-524-3578) and selecting Option 8.

Vulnerable groups — including those who do not have a phone or have challenges using a phone — who are unable to apply by phone can apply in person. Visit ldh.la.gov/page/dsnap to find the nearest location.

Translation services are available throughout the application process. A worker will verify your identity, residency, income, and disaster-related expenses from June 17, 2026, to July 16, 2026. Most applicants will learn their approval status and benefit amount immediately, followed by a confirmation letter sent by mail.

Approved D-SNAP recipients will get their EBT card by mail, regardless of whether they apply by phone or in person.

USDA NONDISCRIMINATION STATEMENT

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) state or local agencies, and their subrecipients, must post the following Nondiscrimination Statement:

To file a program discrimination complaint, a complainant should complete a Form AD-3027, USDA Program Discrimination Complaint Form which can be obtained online at usda.gov/sites/default/files/documents/ad-3027.pdf, from any USDA office, by calling 833-620-1071, or by writing a letter addressed to USDA. The letter must contain the complainant's name, address, telephone number, and a written description of the alleged discriminatory action in sufficient detail to inform the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights (ASCR) about the nature and date of an alleged civil rights violation.
