TERREBONNE PARISH COUNCIL
IN REGULAR SESSION

March 11, 2026

The Chairman, Mr. B. Pledger, called the meeting to order at 6:03 p.m. in the Terrebonne Parish Council Meeting Room. Mr. D. Babin led the Invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance. Upon roll call, Council Members recorded as present were: K. Chauvin, S. Trosclair, B. Pledger, C. Harding, C. Voisin, Jr., J. Amedée, C. K. Champagne, C. Hamner and D. Babin. A quorum was declared present.

Mr. C. Harding moved, seconded by Mr. C. Hamner, “THAT, the Council approve the minutes of the Regular Council Session held on February 11, 2026.”

The Chairman called for a vote on the motion offered by Mr. C. Harding.

The Chairman declared the motion adopted.

The Chairman recognized Constable Kyle Neal, Constable Craig Luke, Constable Elrin Fanguy, Jr., City Marshall Herbert Fitch, Sheriff Tim Soignet, Justice of the Peace Connie Fanguy, and Justice of the Peace Sharon Luke who were in attendance for the proceedings.

Ms. K. Chauvin read the proclamation honoring the life, legacy and public service of Mr. Daniel Joseph Trahan, former law enforcement officer and Constable.

The Chairman recognized Mrs. Maybelle Trahan who thanked the Council and the community for honoring her late husband.

Several Council Members offered their condolences and shared some of their experiences with Mr. Trahan.

The Chairman recognized Ms. Jodie Burton, Clerk of Court, who gave an overview of changes regarding registration and voting procedures for the 2026 closed primary and open elections. She then encouraged the public to consider serving as election commissioners for upcoming and future elections.

The Chairman recognized Ms. Rhonda Rogers, Registrar of Voters, who explained the process for updating voter registrations and noted several efforts to inform voters of the changes prior to the deadline for updating voter registrations.

Discussion ensued relative to the upcoming primary and open elections and the proactive measures being taken by the Clerk of Court and the Registrar of Voters' offices to prepare voters for the changes enacted by state legislature.

Mr. C. Voisin, Jr., read a proclamation proclaiming the month of March 2026 as Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month.

The Chairman recognized Ms. Mary Lynn Bisland, Executive Director of Terrebonne ARC, who thanked the Council for the proclamation. She then gave a brief history on her organization and recognized Mr. Blaise Pellegrin with Terrebonne Parish School Board who was in attendance as well.

Several Council Members commended Ms. Bisland and TARC on their successes and shared their support for efforts to recognize and serve all residents of the parish.

Mr. C. K. Champagne read a proclamation proclaiming the month of March 2026 as "Social Worker Month" in Terrebonne Parish.

The Chairman recognized Ms. Karen Schilling, a social worker in Terrebonne Parish, who thanked the Council for the proclamation and noted the social workers who were recently recognized as 2026 award recipients at state and local levels.

The following resolution was offered by MR. C. HARDING and seconded by MR. C. HAMNER:

RESOLUTION NO.26-081

A RESOLUTION ORDERING AND CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE (I) ROAD LIGHTING DISTRICT NO. 2, (II) ROAD LIGHTING DISTRICT NO. 4, AND (III) THE PARISH OF TERREBONNE, STATE OF LOUISIANA, TO AUTHORIZE THE RENEWAL AND LEVY OF SPECIAL TAXES THEREIN, MAKING APPLICATION TO THE STATE BOND COMMISSION IN CONNECTION THEREWITH AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Parish Council of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, State of Louisiana (the "**Governing Authority**"), acting as the Governing Authority of (i) Road Lighting District No. 2 of the Parish of Terrebonne, State of Louisiana, (ii) Road Lighting District No. 4 of the Parish of Terrebonne, State of Louisiana, (collectively, the "**Districts**") and (iii) the Parish of Terrebonne, State of Louisiana (the "**Parish**"), that:

SECTION 1. Election Call. Subject to the approval of the State Bond Commission, and under the authority conferred by Article VI, Sections 30 and 32 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, together with the applicable provisions of Chapter 5, Chapter 6-A and Chapter 6-B of the Louisiana Election Code, and other constitutional and statutory authority, a special election is hereby called and ordered to be held in the Districts and the Parish on **TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2026** between the hours of six o'clock (6:00) a.m., and eight o'clock (8:00) p.m., in accordance with the provisions of La. R.S. 18:541, and at the said election there shall be submitted to all registered voters qualified and

entitled to vote at the said election under the Constitution and laws of this State and the Constitution of the United States, the following propositions, to-wit:

**ROAD LIGHTING DISTRICT NO. 2 PROPOSITION
(TAX RENEWAL)**

Shall Road Lighting District No. 2 of the Parish of Terrebonne, State of Louisiana (the "District"), continue to levy a three and ninety-nine hundredths (3.99) mills tax on all the property subject to taxation in said District (an estimated \$947,168 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2028 and ending with the year 2037, for the purpose of providing and maintaining electric lights on the streets, roads, highways, alleys and public places within and for said District?

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**ROAD LIGHTING DISTRICT NO. 4 PROPOSITION
(TAX RENEWAL)**

Shall Road Lighting District No. 4 of the Parish of Terrebonne, State of Louisiana (the "District"), continue to levy a four and seventy-five hundredths (4.75) mills tax on all the property subject to taxation within the District (an estimated \$462,300 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2028 and ending with the year 2037, for the purpose of providing and maintaining electric lights on the streets, roads, highways, alleys and public places within and for said District?

**PARISHWIDE PROPOSITION NO. 1 OF 2
(TARC TAX RENEWAL)**

Shall the Parish of Terrebonne, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), continue to levy a five and thirty-three hundredths (5.33) mills tax on all the property subject to taxation within the Parish (an estimated \$5,856,495 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for the entire year), for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2028 and ending with the year 2037, for the purpose of operating, maintaining and constructing facilities for all people with intellectual and developmental disabilities in Terrebonne Parish?

**PARISHWIDE PROPOSITION NO. 2 OF 2
(DRAINAGE MAINTENANCE TAX RENEWAL)**

Shall the Parish of Terrebonne, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), continue to levy a seven and thirty-one hundredths (7.31) mills tax on all the property subject to taxation within the Parish (an estimated \$8,032,078 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2028 and ending with the year 2037, for the purpose of operating, maintaining and constructing drainage works within and for said Parish, title to which shall be in the public?

SECTION 2. Publication of Notice of Election. A Notice of Special Election shall be published in the *Houma Courier*, a newspaper of general circulation within the Parish of Terrebonne, and being the official journal of the Parish, once a week for four consecutive weeks, with the first publication to be made not less than forty-five (45) days nor more than ninety (90) days prior to the date fixed for the election, which Notice shall be substantially in the form attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and incorporated herein by reference the same as if it were set forth herein in full.

SECTION 3. Canvass. This Governing Authority shall meet at its regular meeting place, Council Meeting Room, Government Tower, 8026 Main Street, Houma, Louisiana, Louisiana on **NOVEMBER 25, 2026, at SIX O’CLOCK (6:00) P.M.**, and shall then and there in open and public session proceed to examine and canvass the returns and declare the results of the said election.

SECTION 4. Polling Places. The polling places set forth in the aforesaid Notice of Special Election are hereby designated as the polling places at which to hold the said election,

and the Commissioners-in-Charge and Commissioners, respectively, will be the same persons as those designated in accordance with law.

SECTION 5. Election Commissioners; Voting Machines. The officers designated to serve as Commissioners-in-Charge and Commissioners pursuant to Section 4, or such substitutes as may be selected and designated in accordance with La. R.S. 18:1287, shall hold the said special election as herein provided, and shall make due returns of said election for the meeting of the Governing Authority, as provided in Section 3 hereof. All registered voters in the Parish are entitled to vote at said special election and voting machines shall be used.

SECTION 6. Authorization of Officers. The Parish President and the Clerk of the Governing Authority is hereby empowered, authorized and directed to arrange for and to furnish to said election officers in ample time for the holding of said election, the necessary equipment, forms and other paraphernalia essential to the proper holding of said election and the Authorized Officer is further authorized, empowered and directed to take any and all further action required by State and/or Federal law to arrange for the election.

SECTION 7. Furnishing Election Call to Election Officials. Certified copies of this Resolution shall be forwarded to the Secretary of State, the Clerk of Court and *Ex-Officio* Parish Custodian of Voting Machines, and the Registrar of Voters for the Parish of Terrebonne, State of Louisiana, as notification of the special election called in order so that each may prepare for the election and perform their respective functions as required by law.

SECTION 8. Employment of Counsel. It is recognized, found and determined that a real necessity exists for the employment of Legal Counsel in connection with the election; accordingly, LAFLEUR & LABORDE, namely Eric LaFleur, is hereby employed as legal counsel to perform comprehensive, legal and coordinate professional work with respect to the election. Counsel shall (i) prepare and submit to the Governing Authority for adoption all proceedings incidental to the election; (ii) advise the Governing Authority with respect to the election; and (iii) in the event said election carries, to serve as Bond Counsel in connection with the funding of proceeds of the Tax into Bonds. The fee to be paid Bond Counsel shall be an amount equal or less than the Attorney General's then current Bond Counsel fee schedule and other guidelines for comprehensive, legal and coordinate professional work, together with reimbursement of out-of-pocket expenses incurred and advanced in connection with the election, said fee to be payable by the Governing Authority subject to the Attorney General's written approval of said employment and fee.

SECTION 9. Application to State Bond Commission. Application is made to the State Bond Commission for consent and authority to hold the special election as herein

provided, and in the event that election carries for further consent and authority to dedicate the proceeds of the tax, and a certified copy of this Resolution shall be forwarded to the State Bond Commission on behalf of this Governing Authority, together with a letter requesting the prompt consideration and approval of this application.

SECTION 10. Retirement Contribution. A portion of the monies collected shall be remitted to certain state and statewide retirement systems in the manner required by law.

SECTION 11. Notices. This Governing Authority made the requisite public announcements and other applicable notices with respect to the adoption of this Resolution required by La. R.S. 42:19.1.

SECTION 12. Electronic Signatures. The Governing Authority authorizes Legal Counsel or the Authorized Officer to correct for any clerical errors and to electronically execute any and all documents related to the Resolution in accordance with the Louisiana Uniform Electronic Transactions Act.

RESOLUTION NO. 26-082

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING FOR CERTAIN CLARIFICATIONS TO PREVIOUSLY APPROVED CDBG-DR RECOVERY PROJECT TITLES AND APPROVING THE RENAMING OF THE BAYOU TERREBONNE PUMP STATION PROJECT TO SOUTH HOUMA PUMP STATION

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (“HUD”) has allocated Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery (“CDBG-DR”) funds to the state of Louisiana following major disaster declarations; and

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Division of Administration, Office of Community Development (“LOCD”), on behalf of the State of Louisiana (the “State”), administers the States’s CDBG-DR program, which is subject to the Federal statutes and regulations governing CDBG-DR grants, as modified by exceptions and waivers previously granted and which may hereinafter be granted by HUD; and

WHEREAS, for CDBG-DR funds, LOCD is responsible for the management of programs, reporting and compliance measures; and

WHEREAS, Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government (TPCG) has received funds under the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement (“CEA”) with LOCD, under the Resilient Communities Infrastructure Program (RCIP) to serve as a subrecipient and has the legal authority and responsibility for the rebuilding and recovery of the Terrebonne Parish (the “Parish”); and

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Council previously adopted resolutions approving the submission of CDBG-DR recovery proposals identifying priority and alternate projects for consideration by LOCD; and

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Council previously adopted Resolution No. 23-493 on December 21, 2023, and Resolution No. 24-125 on March 14, 2024, approving the submission of CDBG-DR recovery proposals identifying priority and alternate projects for application to LOCD; and

WHEREAS, during the development of applications and subsequent award of funding, certain projects were assigned official project titles or were administratively

separated into planning, implementation, or direct assistance components at the direction of LOCD in order to meet program requirements; and

WHEREAS, these refinements do not alter the Parish’s original recovery objectives but serve to align project titles and project structure with official LOCD applications, grant agreements, and award documentation, and

WHEREAS, the project previously referenced as the Bayou Terrebonne Pump Station project has been refined and will hereafter be known as the South Houma Pump Station project, with a minor adjustment to the project location to better serve the same intended drainage and resilience objectives of the Parish; and

WHEREAS, the TPCG has attached a consolidated listing of the Parish’s CDBG-DR RCIP priority and alternate projects consistent with current LOCD applications and award documentation inclusive of any revision to naming protocols.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Governments, acting as governing authority of Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana, hereby acknowledges and approves that the project previously referenced as the Bayou Terrebonne Pump Station project shall hereafter be known as the South Houma Pump Station project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Terrebonne Parish Council, hereby acknowledges and approves the clarification of project titles associated with previously approved CDBG-DR recovery initiatives included as Attachment A.

Ms. K. Chauvin stated the highway mentioned within the ordinance should be Highway 56, not Highway 55, and that she would like to remain impartial to the families within her district that may like to memorialize their loved ones.

At the request of the Chairman, Ms. Michelle Neil, Parish Attorney stated the ordinance would need to be revised to change the verbiage from Highway 55 to Highway 56.

Mr. C. Voisin, Jr. stated that he and his family had discussed the potential of memorializing his father and having his name live on within the parish then thanked the Chairman, the Council, and the community for their support.

Ms. Lambert shared her appreciation for the cooperative efforts between local agencies to recognize and address the issues and concerns for those residents with special needs.

Several Council Members shared their appreciation of the ongoing efforts of Ms. Lambert and the local agencies to address and provide for residents with needs.

The Chairman recognized Ms. Kristy Boudloche, a resident of Houma, who shared her concerns regarding a residence adjacent to hers which recently suffered fire damage and the residents now living in unsafe conditions that could become a health hazard to others.

At the request of Mr. S. Trosclair, Planning and Zoning Director Christopher Pulaski stated that the residence in question was slated to be considered in April for condemnation and that other violations were in effect prior to and following the fire event. He then recommended that a condemnation hearing be called for Wednesday, March 25, 2026, to expedite the proceedings to consider condemning the property.

Mr. C. Voisin, Jr., moved, seconded by Mr. S. Trosclair, “THAT, the Council call a condemnation hearing on the residential structure located at 306 Duet Street, Houma, owned by Earline Margaret Savoie Slaaen, on Wednesday, March 25, 2026, at 6:30 p.m.” (***MOTION ADOPTED AFTER DISCUSSION**)

At the Chairman's request, Parish Attorney Michelle Neil clarified that the item was sufficiently notified on the agenda and that a condemnation hearing could be called on the structure at this time.

Discussion ensued relative to adding updated zoning and code violations regarding shipping containers and pods via an ordinance and procedural triggers that would constitute the involvement of the Department of Public Health.

*The Chairman called for a vote on the aforementioned motion offered by Mr. C. Voisin, Jr.
