The Chairman, Mr. C. Harding, called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m. in the Terrebonne Parish Council Meeting Room. Mr. B. Pledger offered the Invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance. The Chairman recognized Mr. Curtis Marcello Jr., a Houma resident, who reported on a Notice of Intent that was passed by the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries Commission and shared his concerns on how the decision will hurt Louisiana's natural resources and seafood industry.

- A. An ordinance to Enact a New Article XIX and New Section 2-590 Under Chapter 2 of the Terrebonne Parish Code to Provide a Process for Citizens to Apply for the Abandonment of Public Servitudes, Rights-Of-Way, and Other Dedicated Properties which are No Longer Useful or Needed for Public Purposes and to Reserve Chapter 2, Article XVIII, Sections 2-571 through 2-589.

The Chairman recognized Mr. Alex Ostheimer, a Houma resident, who shared his opinions on the proposed ordinance and suggested that the ordinance be re-worded so that it safeguards the public's use of dedicated property.

The Chairman recognized Mr. Dustin Pellegrin, representing Price Brothers Shipyard, who gave a brief history of his client's attempts to lift the public right-of-way for a dedicated property and the number of administrative and financial requirements involved in the process. He then suggested that the ordinance should be revised to remove the financial burden of de-dedicating property from citizens.

Discussion ensued relative to opposing the proposed ordinance and supporting potential changes to the ordinance that were in-line with other entities regarding dedicated properties.

The Chairman recognized Parish Attorney Michelle Neil who stated that some dedicated properties have utilities such as gas or electricity which require public access then offered other factors that could impact dedicated properties. She then noted that, in some cases, public records have been insufficient in determining dedicated properties or rights-of-way for the parish which can cause increased legal fees due to time invested.

Discussion ensued relative to utility servitudes and measures to streamline the process of records management regarding these properties.

At the request of Ms. K. Chauvin, Mr. Pellegrin explained that his client paid for multiple surveys and encountered several obstacles while obtaining ownership documents for the dedicated property.

The Chairman recognized Chief Administrative Officer Noah Lirette who stated he would like to standardize the process of dedication and agreed that the ordinance could be reviewed and modified if needed.

Several Council Members recommended that the ordinance be tabled to a later meeting to allow for additional review and discussion prior to adoption.

At the request of Mr. C. Voisin, Jr., Ms. Neil explained that, if there is a large servitude and utilities are a factor, it is possible to de-dedicate the right of way but maintain a servitude wide enough to have access to those facilities next to the road right-of-way. She then gave an overview on the procedure followed for a recently de-dedicated property.

ORDINANCE NO. 9769

AN ORDINANCE TO DEDICATE THE HANCOCK WHITNEY BANK BUILDING IN HONOR OF THE LATE DON SCHWAB BY RENAMING THE BUILDING THE DON SCHWAB CENTER FOR BUSINESS AND GOVERNMENT AND AMEND CERTAIN SECTIONS OF THE TERREBONNE PARISH CODE OF ORDINANCES TO REFLECT THE NEW NAME.

SECTION I

WHEREAS, Section 1-06 of the Home Rule Charter for Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government (TPCG) provides that the Parish Government shall have the right, power and authority to pass all ordinances requisite or necessary to promote, protect and preserve the general welfare, safety, health, peace and good order of the parish, including but not by way of limitation, the right, power and authority to pass ordinances on all subject matters necessary requisite or proper for the management of parish affairs, and all other subject matters without exception, subject only to the limitation that the same shall not be inconsistent with the Constitution or expressly denied by general law applicable to the parish; and

WHEREAS, Don Schwab showed extraordinary physical aptitude throughout his life beginning with an athletic career at Thibodaux High School that continued at Louisiana State University where he became the only fullback in LSU football history to lead the SEC in rushing yards; and

WHEREAS, Don was known as "Coach" to many during his professional journey where he enjoyed teaching and coaching at high school and college levels at schools in New Orleans, Baton Rouge, Gray, Houma, and Thibodaux before transitioning as the Director of Terrebonne Parish Recreation; and

WHEREAS, Don was a resident of Terrebonne Parish and former Parish President from 2004-2008, when he steered the Parish to recovery after Hurricanes Katrina and Rita devastated our area; and

WHEREAS, Don's career in public service expanded when he continued his years of service with the District Attorney's office, working as a case manager in the Truancy Reduction Program; and

WHEREAS, Don, at his core, was a devoted husband and family man who spent as much time as he could uplifting and supporting his children and grandchildren, never missing events or activities. He was also a dear friend that offered a helping hand or listening ear whenever called upon; and

WHEREAS, Don feverishly dedicated his life to service, both in his community and family; and

WHEREAS, Don's life served as an example of selflessness, dedication, stewardship, and discipline; and

WHEREAS, Don was a wealthy man by all standards, measured by his impact on others and cherished by those who knew and loved him. He will be sorely missed and leaves behind a fond legacy; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Don departed this earth on October 19, 2024, surrounded by his family; and

WHEREAS, in honor of Mr. Don, and to celebrate his local service and character, the Terrebonne Parish President and the Terrebonne Parish Council wish to preserve his legacy by renaming the Hancock Whitney Bank Building in his memory, the **Don Schwab Center for Business and Government**;

SECTION II

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Parish President and the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, that the Hancock Whitney Bank Building be and is hereby renamed **Don Schwab Center for Business and Government**.

SECTION III

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FUTHER ORDAINED, by the Terrebonne Parish Council that Sections 2-452 and 2-453 of the Parish Code of Ordinances shall be and are hereby amended to read as follows (using strike through to delete, and underlining to add):
Sec. 2-452. Hancock Whitney Bank building and parking Don Schwab Center for Business and Government.

The building and improvements situated at 7910 Main Street, Houma LA 70360, containing approximately ninety-eight thousand (98,000) square feet of office space together with the parking spaces, and adjacent parking lot at 606 Belanger Street, Houma LA 70360, shall be referred to for the purposes of this Code as the Hancock Whitney Bank building and parking Don Schwab Center for Business and Government.

Sec. 2-453. Rental of Terrebonne Parish Government Tower and parking garage and Hancock Whitney Bank building and parking area Don Schwab Center for Business and Government.

- (a) The parish president is charged with the responsibility of assessment of the square footage in the Terrebonne Parish Government Tower and the Hancock Whitney Bank building Don Schwab Center for Business and Government available for government use and to advise the parish council of any surplus space available for commercial occupancy.

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SECTION IV

NOW, LET IT FURTHER BE ORDAINED that any section, clause, paragraph, provision, or portion of these regulations found to be invalid is severable and shall not affect the validity of the whole.

SECTION V

NOW, LET IT FURTHER BE ORDAINED that any ordinance or part thereof in conflict herewith is hereby repealed.

SECTION VI

NOW, LET IT FURTHER BE ORDAINED that the Parish President is authorized and directed to change and/or install appropriate signage on the building to reflect the renaming of the building.

SECTION VII

NOW, LET IT FURTHER BE ORDAINED that this ordinance shall become effective upon approval by the Parish President or as otherwise provided in Section 2-13(b) of the Home Rule Charter for a Consolidated Government for Terrebonne Parish, whichever occurs sooner.

WHEREAS, the governing authority of Terrebonne Parish has the authority under **Louisiana Revised Statutes 18:532** to establish and modify precinct boundaries; and

WHEREAS, **RS 18:532** requires that all precincts have clearly observable boundaries and be contiguous; and

WHEREAS, the Registrar of Voters for Terrebonne Parish has identified precincts with fewer than 300 active registered voters as per **R.S. 18:532B**; and

WHEREAS, the Registrar of Voters has provided recommendations to merge certain precincts to ensure compliance with state law and enhance the efficiency of election administration; and

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Council seeks to act upon these recommendations in the best interests of the voters;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TERREBONNE PARISH COUNCIL THAT:

Section 1. **Section 30-2 of the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances** is hereby amended as follows:

A. The following voting precincts shall be merged, and their boundaries redefined:

1. Precincts 21 and 62 are hereby merged into a single precinct, henceforth referred to as **Precinct 62**, with the boundaries as follows:

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT (“TPCG”) TO ACQUIRE IMMOVABLE PROPERTY IDENTIFIED AS LOTS 1-B, 2-B, 3-A1, AND 3-A2, OF BLOCK 2 OF

SOUTHDOWN INDUSTRIAL PARK SUBDIVISION, TERREBONNE PARISH, LOUISIANA, AND TO AUTHORIZE THE PARISH PRESIDENT OR HIS OFFICIAL DESIGNEE, THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER, TO EXECUTE ANY AND ALL DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO ACQUIRE SAID PROPERTY, AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE THERETO.

WHEREAS, Since December 2021, TPCG has this location under a triple net lease for the purposes of operating the H&HS Department; and

WHEREAS, TPCG will purchase this property, contingent upon an approved environmental clearance for the permanent operations of the H&HS Department; and

WHEREAS, TPCG desires to purchase the property located at 4800 Highway 311, Houma, Louisiana, 70360, as more fully described herein, in full ownership, to facilitate the aforementioned needs and/or purposes, for consideration that the Parish President, Jason W. Bergeron, deems just and reasonable, not to exceed the fair market value; and

WHEREAS, an appraisal and review appraisal of the property valued it at four million, three hundred seven thousand and no/100 (\$4,307,000.00) dollars;

WHEREAS, all funding for the purchase of this property comes from CDBG-DR and FEMA Public Assistance;

SECTION I

in full ownership; that the Parish President, Jason W. Bergeron, or his official designee, the Chief Administrative Officer, is hereby authorized and empowered for and on behalf of the TPCG to execute documents necessary to acquire the property in full ownership for the above stated purpose for consideration he deems just and reasonable, not to exceed the fair market value of four million, three hundred seven thousand and no/100 (\$4,307,000.00) Dollars;

SECTION IV

WHEREAS, the Road and Bridge revenues from the LAMP-interest require a \$15,000 decrease.

At the request of Mr. S. Trosclair, Ms. Mauldin explained the various transfers and stated the new bonds are not included at this time but will be presented in a budget amendment. She then affirmed that sufficient funds are included to pay for principal and interest for bonds while maintaining a reasonable balance.

- Transfer to Capital Projects Fund (\$3,401,027):
 - Chiller Rentals (Government Tower, Jail), \$301,027
 - Major government building repairs, \$350,000

- Jail Chillers, \$750,000
- Courthouse Annex HVAC, \$1,600,000

- Proposed Ending Fund Balance - \$2,913,483

Maintain a reasonable balance for future bond payments and unforeseen expenditures (optimum 60 - 75% of next year's bond debt.

At the Chairman's inquiring, Ms. Mauldin clarified that the Chiller Rentals for the Government Tower and Parish Jail are expected to end once repairs have been completed. She then shared that the bid process will begin soon for new chillers, but there is no timeline for the rental to end at this time. Ms. Mauldin then affirmed that capital projects funds are being used to provide for the chiller rentals at this time and that emergency funding for the Parish Jail was used to address other projects.

B.) Road District #6:
